CRESCENT SOCIETY GENERAL MEETING MINUTES
May 22, 2010
OKC ZOO

President Bill Henson opened the meeting at 12:35 p.m. He stated the purpose of this meeting was to present, discuss and vote on the action taken by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors of the Crescent Society on January 16, 2010 to disband the Crescent Society due to the inability of the Society to attract volunteers to serve in any capacity toward the continuing functions of the society.

Dick Weathers took the floor to discuss the numerous e-mails and phone calls he received from Dennis Hill, Pete Phillips, Skip Cameron, Jim Patton, George McFadden George Eifler, Bert Cisco, and apparently many others from other parts of the U.S. who wished to see the Crescent Society continue.

Bill Henson suggested two or perhaps four meetings per year with all of them being at lunchtime, since many people our age

do not like to get out after dark. People seemed to be receptive to this. Henson then took up the motion to disband The Crescent Society.

The motion **failed** which keeps The Crescent Society active.

At this point Bill Henson asked for nominations for president. There were no nominations. Bill once again asked for nominations and there were none. Bill asked for nominations for the third time at which point Dick Weathers said we need someone to volunteer for the job, since it is easy. Therefore Dick said he would take the job as president and was appointed by acclamation. Weathers also said the newsletter could be handled from someone out of town - for instance the newsletter could be done in Austin, TX.

Bill then asked for nominations and/or volun-

teers for Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. Again there were no nominations. Bob Hickey was the sole volunteer who agreed to remain as Treasurer and was approved by acclamation. At this point it was decided that the newly elected board (Weathers and Hickey) would meet to attempt to fill the other vacancies, even asking out of town members to volunteer to serve in some capacity.

Dick Weathers made a motion to hold future lunches at the Cowboy Hall of Fame. Motion passed.

Bill Henson thanked everyone who was on the board the past 2 years and thanked Glenda for her support.

The meeting adjourned at 12:55 p.m.
